Report of SA [REDACTED] entitled "WORLD EVENTS COMMITTEE, aka, IS-C" (Bufile 100-355325) dated 10/6/52 at Washington, D. C. (page 14, paragraph 2) reflects information to the effect that MILDRED RYDER was representing Philadelphia Publishing Office of World Events, Philadelphia, Pa., in 1946.

In view of Mrs. RYDER's connection with the World Events organization previously described, information was forwarded to the Miami Office by letter dated 3/31/53. This information was directed to Miami for information in view of the fact that the World Events Headquarters is located in E. Platka, Fla.

The Newark Office was advised on 4/3/53 that the indices of the Miami Office were negative concerning MILDRED RYDER.

A two page communication entitled "PEACE PILGRIM MESSAGE" which was received in May, 1953, by the "White Record" a Dallas, Tex., newspaper, was transmitted to the Dallas Office on 5/13/53. This communication was forwarded by Dallas to the Newark Office in letter of 5/18/53. The following is a summary of the information contained in this communication:

"Peace Pilgrim Message"

The "Peace Pilgrim" listed the following three petitions:

- 1) Plead for peace in Korea
- 2) Plead for a Peace Department - It is indicated that this plea would be directed to the President and national leaders by the "Peace Pilgrim" when she reaches Washington, D. C.
- 3) Plead for world disarmament and reconstruction. It is indicated that this plea will be made to the United Nations by the "Peace Pilgrim" when she reaches New York City

The remainder of this communication states that the Peace Pilgrimage is solely in the interest of peace and sponsored by no organization. The scheduled itinerary was described as follows: 1/1/52, Los Angeles, Cal., to San Diego; Highway 80 through Phoenix, Tuscon, Lacruces, El Paso, Oklahoma City, Wichita, Kan., St. Louis, Chicago, Detroit, and then Washington, D. C.; estimated 5,000 miles; estimated duration, 1 year; average daily destination, 25 miles. This communication will be retained in the Newark files subject to request for same by the Bureau.
